COURSE DESCRIPTION

Photography, Narrative and Psychoanalysis will explore storytelling in connection to the role of our unconscious to symbolism and the imagery we make. We will reflect on the unconscious as housing memories that structure our narrative, and the relationship between these narratives and the images we create. The photograph as a medium speaks to memory, time, and the archive and is uniquely suited to create connections between personal and public.
